Jeff Cohn produces a number of proprietary wines, and I tasted three of his current releases. The 2013 Smoke & Mirrors is a Rhone Valley-inspired lend of 37% Zinfandel, 25% Petite Sirah, 24% Syrah, and the rest smaller quantities of Alicante Bouschet and Grenache coming from Multiple AVAs in California ranging from Amador and Paso Robles to Napa and Sonoma. A terrific bargain at \$25.00, this seriously endowed, juicy, seductive style of wine is Jeff Cohn's version of a high-end Cote du Rhone. Plenty of ripe blackberry and black cherry fruit, some beef blood and grilled meats along with Provencal Herbs, spice and licorice are all present in this meaty, medium to full-bodied, lusty wine.
