**91 Pts** A value-priced blend of 80% Zinfandel and 20% Petite Sirah brought up all in neutral barrels, the 2016 Deal Maker is a ripe, upfront, fruit bomb that has class. Ripe red and black cherries, cedary spice, melted licorice, and underbrush notes all emerge from this plump, sexy red that carries loads of fruit and charm. It over delivers and is well worth seeking out. Drink it over the coming 2-3 years.

## WINE ENTHUSIAST.

**91 Pts** Big but smooth, this full-flavored wine layers tasty blackberry and black cherry over hints of vanilla, mint and dark chocolate for a complex and enticing character overall. It is full bodied, moderately tannic and well balanced on a big scale. Jeff Cohn made it with 80% Zinfandel and 20% Petite Sirah, so it could have been labeled as Zin.

CONNOISSEURS' GUIDE TO CALIFORNIA WINE

**90 Pts** If you find a better Zinfandel for \$20, rush out and buy it, but, until then, rush out

and grab this one. It is, in almost all ways, part and parcel of the mish-pocha (look it up; it's a good word to know) save for the fact that Cohn has moderated its tannins and ripeness while not giving up much of his trademark depth and clear varietal focus. It is on the direct, juicy, drink-

me-now side yet will certainly deliver well if allowed to age for bit. It's a real steal in high quality Zin.
